E.D.E. Accredits the First College in Germany

President of E.D.E., Mr. Wilfried Schlüter, Ph.D., had a great pleasure to accredit Zwickau College in west Saxony as an academic educational institution for E.D.E. directors. Mrs. Ute Rosenbaum, Ph.D. received the charter for accreditation in her capacity as the Dean of Science for Health and Social Care. She emphasized the importance of this accreditation for the college and graduates majoring in management of social care and medical services.

Already in 1993, at the fourth E.D.E. Congress in London, Prof. Schlüter was advocating for professionalisation and academization of the profession of care home directors. The German Association of Directors of Homes for the Elderly and the Disabled (DVLAB), which is a member of E.D.E., has recognized the necessity three years ago and is now making bigger efforts for the academization of our profession. E.D.E. welcomes such development and has on several occasions offered its support to DVLAB.

In future, joint efforts will be necessary; there will be thorough changes that could be proactively created by highly qualified persons, especially in the area of long-term care.

Fly High with E-Qalin

After a three year period, the E-Qalin project (specific qualitative management system for social care for the elderly) which is supported by the EU, was successfully released for independent work. At the final seminar in Bremen, Germany, the entire project was rated and results of an accompanied survey implemented by the Zwickau College, from west Saxony, under the leadership of Mrs. Ute Rosenbaum, Ph.D., and Mr. Wilfried Schlüter, Ph.D., were presented. The research results can be summed up – research report has a total of 1,500 pages – with the following sentence: E-Qalin is a successful European project, which on the one hand increases the quality of care and satisfaction of residents and collaborators, and on the other evidently improves the management of the institutions.

E.D.E. supports the further expansion of QM in Europe, among other things, by having developed a concept for the E-Qalin award, which is awarded to the three best institutions in Europe. Best practice – is an important innovative step for care home directors in Europe, which can intensify networking for the benefit of all.

For now, an additional study E-Qalin is available in Austria, Slovenia, Italy, Luxembourg and Germany. There are already queries from other European countries. E.D.E. is available to the national associations of directors for social care for the elderly if they wish to establish such study in their own country.
